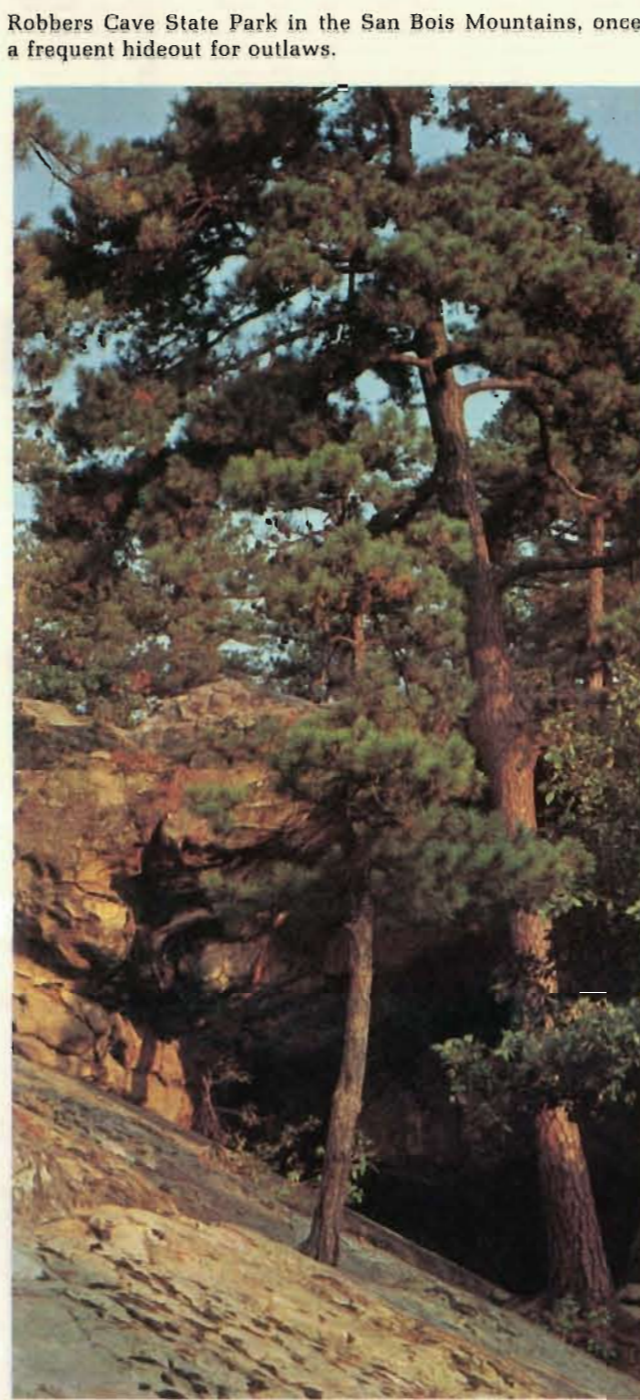
The Cowboy Hall of Fame and Western Heritage Center in Oklahoma City.



Kiamichi Mountains in the Ouachita National Forest of southeastern Oklahoma.



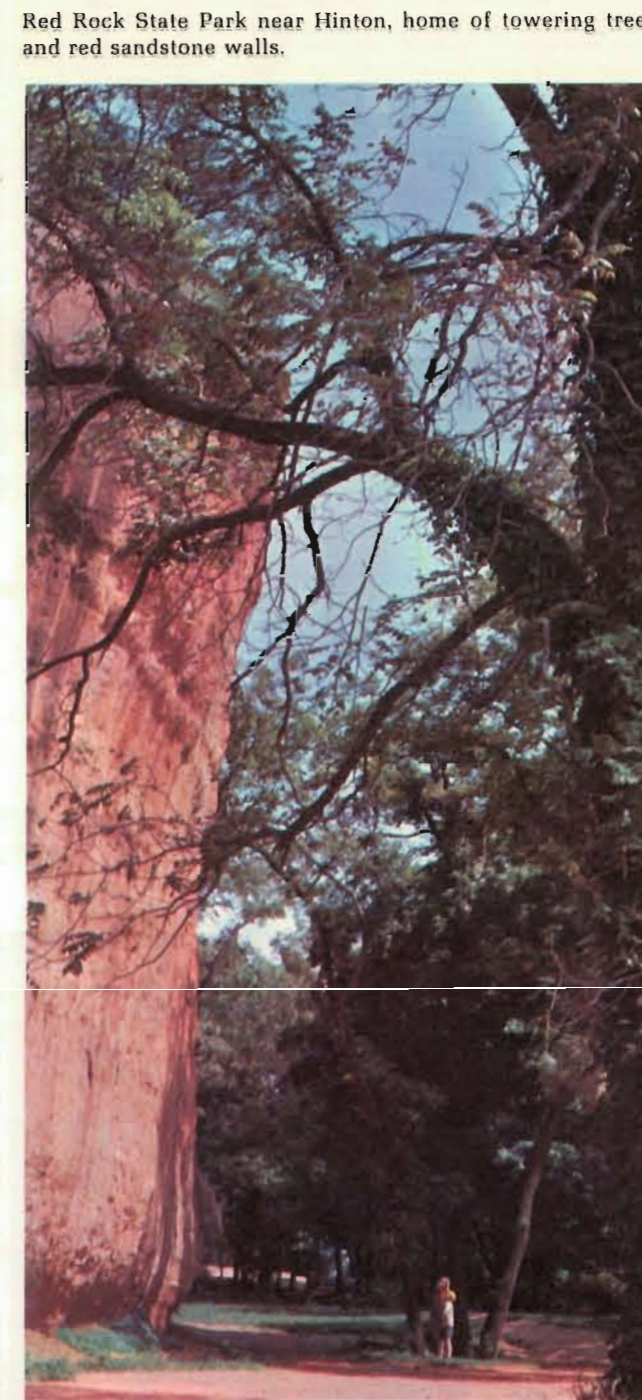
Two metropolitan centers provide a year around calendar of cultural events.



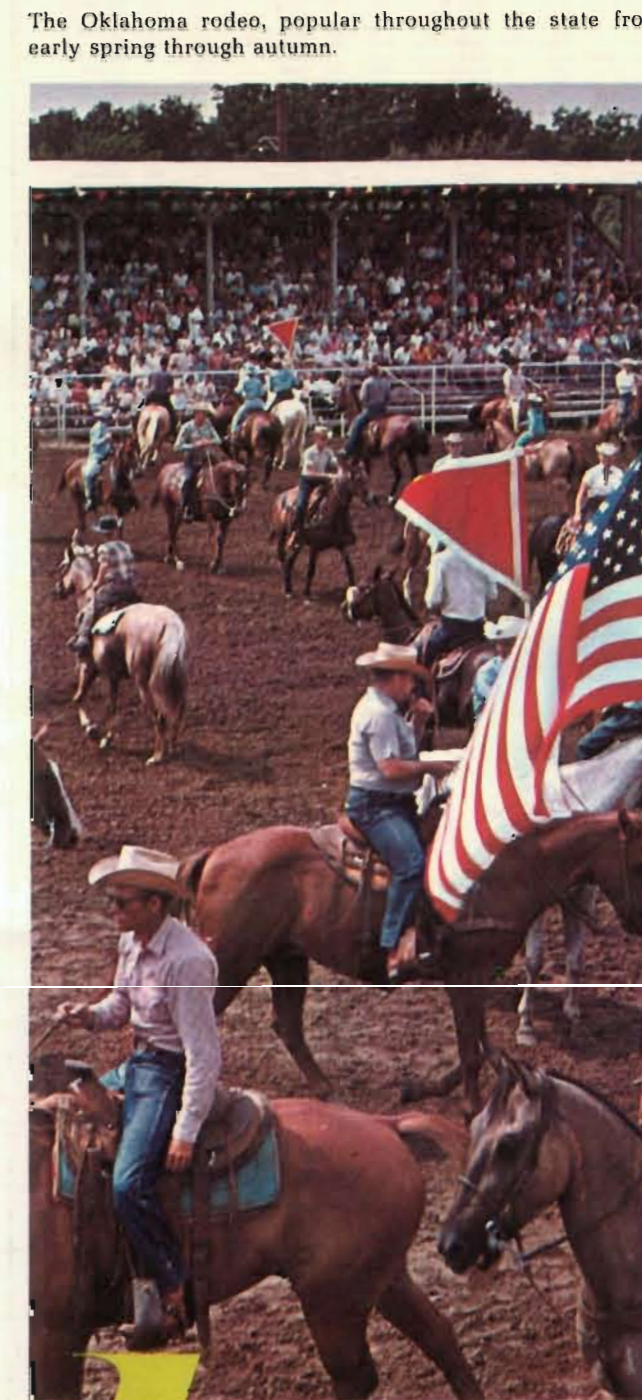
Robbers Cave State Park in the San Bois Mountains, once a frequent hideout for outlaws.

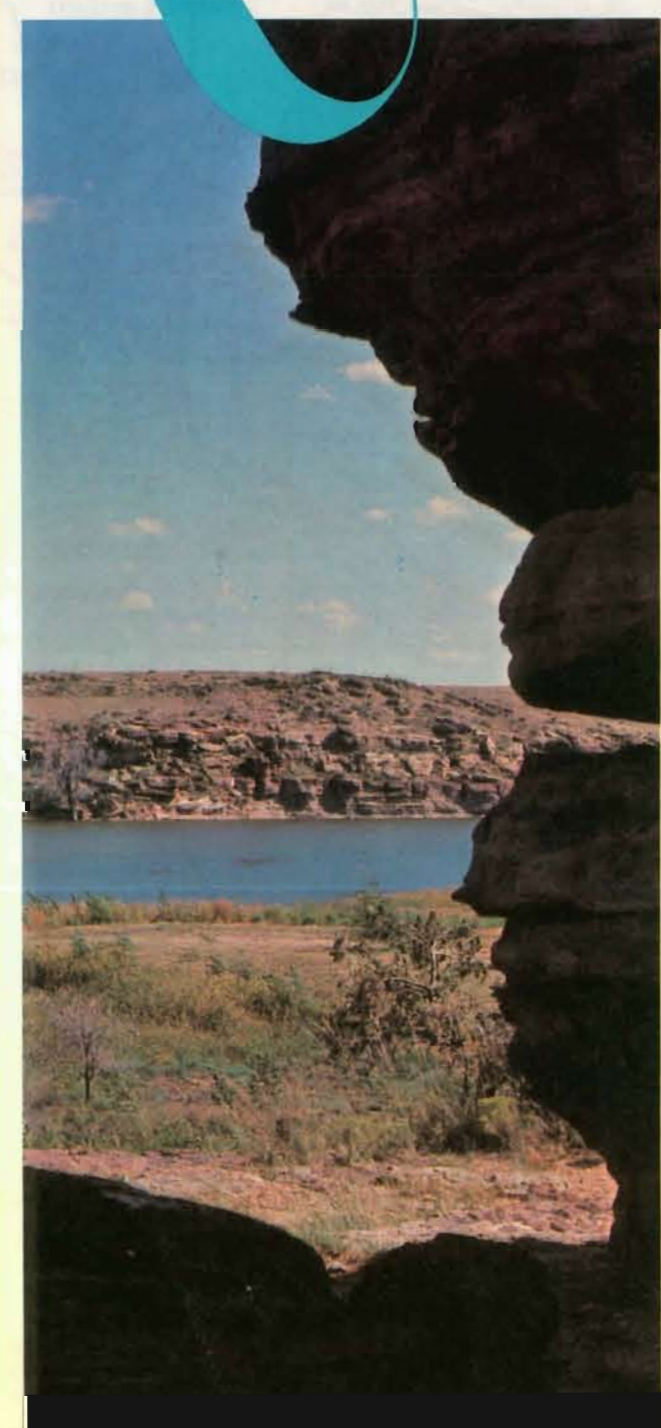

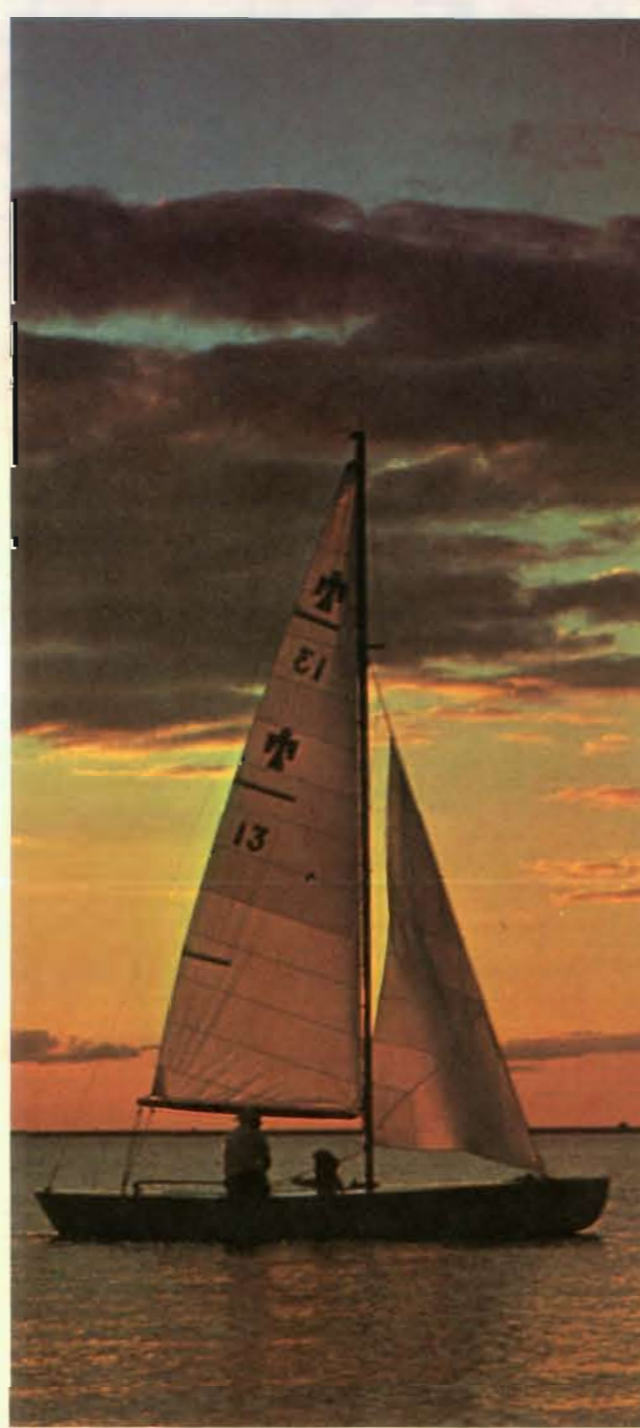
Black Mesa State Park high in the Panhandle illustrates the contrast of Oklahoma scenery.



Oklahoma offers over 250 public courses for year-around pleasure.



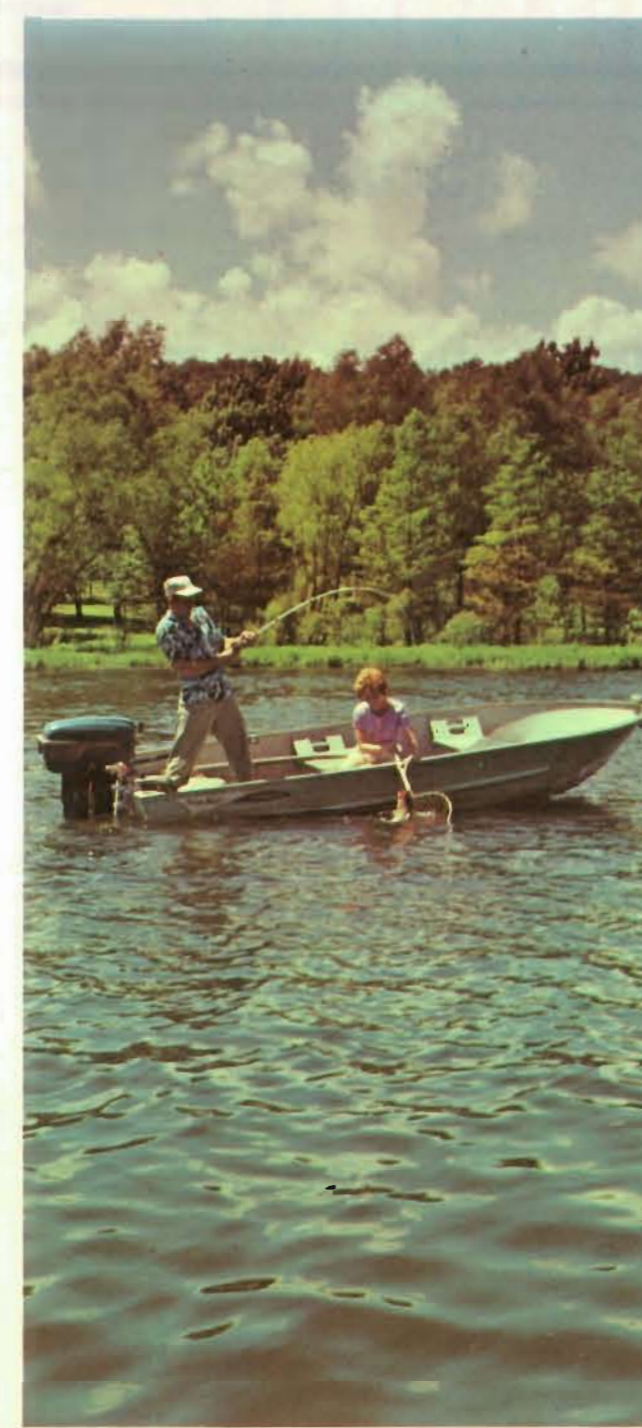
The peaceful setting for Boiling Springs State Park in northwestern Oklahoma.



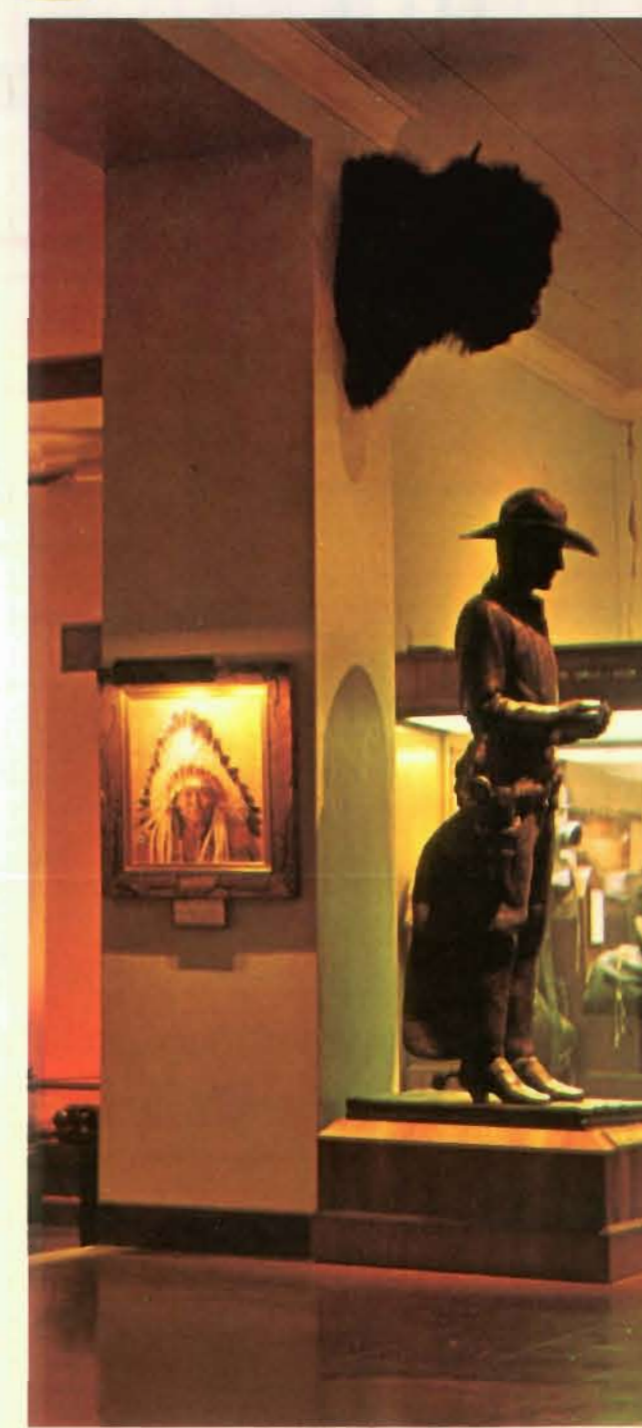
Oklahoma's over 1700 square miles of water draws boating enthusiasts by the thousands.
