Oklahoma 2010, 2009, 2008 and National 2009 Statistics

Nationwide 2009 (most recent complete statistics)

- 🚧 In 2009, 667 people were killed in highway work zone collisions nationwide
- 🚧 This is down from 2008, when 716 people were killed in work zone collisions.

Oklahoma 2010- preliminary

- 🚧 18 people were killed in Oklahoma highway work zones in 2010.
- 🚧 Also in 2010 , preliminary figures show that 748 people were injured in 1,407 collisions in Oklahoma work zones, the highest number of work zone collisions and greatest amount of injuries in the last decade.
- 🚧 This is a 80% increase in fatalities and a 73% increase in the number of accidents in work zones since 2005.
- 🚧 The greatest number of collisions resulted from following too close, traveling at unsafe speeds and driver inattention.

Oklahoma 2009

- 🚧 18 people were killed in Oklahoma work zones in 2009
- 🚧 768 people were injured in 1,285 collisions

Oklahoma 2008

- 🚧 11 people were killed in Oklahoma work zones in 2007
- 🚧 668 people were injured in 1,126 collisions
