The property was formerly used as a Kawasaki dealership and also carried a full line of outdoor sports equipment. The building has two small offices, a breakroom with refrigerator, sink and stove, and a two-bay shop with overhead doors. The entry/front area of the building was used as a customer service area with ample room for display of equipment and accessories. A built-in fish pond with waterfall remains in this middle of the retail area

of the building. The paved lot to the west of the building is partially fenced with chain link and three strand barbed wire at the top with double swinging gates.

LEGAL DESCRIPTION

A strip, piece or parcel of land lying in part of the E½ of Government Lot 4 and the W½ of Government Lot 3 of Section 26, T25N, R23E in Delaware County, Oklahoma. Said parcel of land being described by metes and bounds as follows:

Commencing at the NE corner of said W½, thence N 89°52'W along the North line of said Section 26 a distance of 786.14 to the original West right-of-way of State Highway No. 59 and the point of beginning, thence N 89°52'W a distance of 542.92 feet to the NW corner of the E½ of Gov. Lot 4, thence S 00°12'59" E along the West line of said E½ a distance of 17.26 feet, thence S 87°47'06" E a distance of 154.69 feet, thence S 10°14'44" E a distance of 228.19 feet, S 89°59'56" E a distance of 359.68 feet to a point on the original West right-of-way of State Highway No. 59, thence Northeasterly along said right-of-way line on a curve to the right having a radius of 3,569.70 feet and a distance of 246.86 feet to said point of beginning.
