

DBE TRAINING GRANT

- Funds are available for up to five (5) DBE firms and limited to \$1000.00 each.
- Training must be necessary to achieve proficiency to compete, on an equal basis, for ODOT contracts and subcontracts.
- The training must be requested on the DBE Training Grant Requirement Form two (2) months in advance of the training date. Once approved, the funds are issued on a first come first served basis.
