THE INTERMODAL PLAN

Oklahoma's Intermodal Transportation Plan is the document that provides direction for developing the state's transportation system. Informally described as the 2035 Long Range Plan (LRP), it embraces all surface transportation modes: pedestrian, bicycle, ports/waterways, highways, freight facilities, rail, transit and surface access to airports. It also provides a basis for defining the funding program that implements the plan. The LRP is updated every five (5) years and is a policy document that guides the development of a safe and efficient transportation system for the State of Oklahoma.

OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE OF THE SYSTEM

The Long Range Plan looks ahead and identifies the goals and policies for the State over the next 25 years. The Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) is a short range document that identifies projects that are slated for implementation over the next four (4) years. While these plans / programs are being developed, the ODOT employees are also administering programs like the rural transit systems, and maintaining the state-owned roads, bridges, railroads, etc. Engineers and planners are also monitoring and studying travel data, evaluating the safety and condition of the transportation system, working with local and federal partner agencies, and looking at a wide array of data about the system. All of this information goes in to developing project concepts for the STIP.

THE STIP

The next step for these projects is inclusion in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The STIP is developed by ODOT biennially and contains all federally funded and regionally significant projects to be implemented during the next four (4) years. This is not a final schedule of projects but is a "best estimate" at the time of STIP development. For information regarding the STIP, contact The Coordinator at STIP@odot.org.
