


OKLAHOMA 2011-2012 STATE RAILROAD MAP

ON THE COVER: TIME magazine recognized the Heartland Flyer biodesel test as one of "The 50 Best Inventions of 2010." The Heartland Flyer was selected for a year long test route utilizing a biodesel blend known as B20 (20% pure biodesel and 80% diesel). The test will measure exhaust emissions and engine wear using a renewable fuel source. This test became a reality when Amtrak received a \$274,000 Federal Railroad Administration grant to carry out the research project. The Oklahoma Department of Transportation was the lead agency with support from the Texas Department of Transportation. Amtrak's locomotive #600, a General Electric P32-8, 3,200 horsepower, 12 cylinder engine was selected as the test vehicle. With the actual test ending in the spring of 2011, results of the test should be known later in the year.

The Heartland Flyer carried a record 81,749 passengers in 2010 and is on course to break the record in 2011. The Heartland Flyer is also Amtrak's #1 rated train in customer satisfaction. It makes a daily round trip from between Oklahoma City and Fort Worth, Texas with stops at Norman, Purcell, Pauls valley, Ardmore and Gainsville.
