



Oklahoma is a state brimming with vacation opportunities. You may wish to relax in secluded resort surroundings, enjoy the advantages of the larger city hotels and exciting nightlife, hide away in a cozy cabin or pitch a tent along a sparkling take or river!

Oklahoma offers a myriad of vacation experiences for it is a water wonderland rich in the ways of the Olo Wesi, with more than 200 lakes, a nosi of cowboy and Indian attractions and events and 60 state resort, park

and recreation areas. Tent camping is permitted in most state parks and recreation areas for a nominal fee. Assigned camping is available at many properties and is discounted (half-price) for both senior citizens 62 years of age or older and for totally disabled individuals. RV sites in assigned areas may be reserved

by calling the individual park or recreation area. Nine state parks offer cental cabins and five parks feature luxurious resort accommodations all of the resorts are nestled on the shores of beautiful lakes : Lake Mulray and Lake Texoma Resorts lie on lakes of the same name in scenic southern Oklahorna : Quartz Mountain Resort in the southwest is adjacent to lovely Lake Allus Ligert, Roman Nose Resort Guest Ranch is parched on a peninsula that juts into the clear waters of Lake Fort Gibson in northeastern Gulahoma's Seguoyah State Park Most resort properties feature golf courses, tennis courts, riding stables, swimming poors, trailer hookups, fishing docks theated in winter; marinas restaurants, naturalist programs, meeting facilities, organized recreation, confortable rooms and cozy cabins


