The purpose of this project

The purpose of this project is to improve the existing facility of U.S. 277 from U.S. 62 to I-44 in Comanche Co., OK.

Providing two 12' lanes with 10' shoulders on an offset alignment to the South offering vertical alignment corrections as well as an improved rail-road crossing and other improvements.



Construction Factors

- Environmental Constraints
 - Public Recreation Area
 - National Cemetery
 - Native American Land
- Cost of utility relocation
- Availability of alignment improvements
- Use of existing Cache Creek Bridge
- Remain open to traffic during construction



Project Information

- Project Length = 4.439 Miles
- Est. Project Cost = \$11.5 Million
- Right of Way estimated Spring 2011
- Construction estimated Spring 2013
- Includes improved Rail-Road Crossing
- Road to remain open during construction
- Project will utilize existing bridge at Cache creek.






