## Public urged to submit comments on future Oklahoma City Crosstown Boulevard by May 21

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation and the City of Oklahoma City, are asking citizens to take part in shaping the elements included in the future OKC Boulevard. The agencies hosted a public meeting last week and are providing information on design alternatives on ODOT's website <u>www.okladot.state.ok.us</u>. Comments are being requested through Wednesday, May 21st.

Citizens who live, work or frequent the downtown area are urged to review the options presented and share their feedback on topics such as:

- Preferred Design Alternative
- Ease of Access
- Traffic Flow
- Walkabilit
- Bycicle and Pedestrian Accmodations
- Roadway Features

ODOT and its partners are asking local citizens to voice their opinions about their priorities on what aspects and functions they would like to see included in the new boulevard.

The overall Boulevard project is estimated at \$80 million, which includes approximately \$50 million for connections to the new interstate on the east and west ends of the corridor and approximately \$30 million for the new downtown roadway as part of the Oklahoma City Crosstown Boulevard.
