
US Highway 169 Relocation - Nowata County

Transfer from the State Highway System a segment of old road designated as US Highway 169, beginning at its junction with State Highway 28 south of Delaware and extending north via Delaware to its junction with State Highway 10 east of Lenapah, a distance of 6.5 miles. This segment of old road will be transferred to the local jurisdiction of the cities of Delaware and Lenapah and Nowata County for further maintenance or abandonment.

Add to the State Highway System a segment of new road to be designated as US Highway 169, beginning at its junction with State Highway 28 south of Delaware and extending north to its junction with State Highway 10 east of Lenapah, a distance of 6.0 miles.

This revision to the State Highway System will be effective upon completion of construction of Project F-193(8).



Dear Mr. Ward:

The U.S. Route Numbering Subcommittee has considered your applications for the relocation of U.S. Route 62 between Altus and Lawton and the relocation of U.S. Route 169 between Nowata and South Coffeyville, and favorable action has been taken upon these two requests.

The establishment of U.S. Route 377 between Madill and Cleveland has been denied, as the Committee did not feel that there had been sufficient demonstration of a need for a U.S. Route in this area, since there appears to be over concentration of U.S. Routes.

The U.S. Route Numbering Subcommittee has suggested that you review the entire sequence of U.S. Routes running north and south, between Tulsa and Oklahoma City, to see if some realignment or elimination might not be possible.

Attached you will find the two copies of the approved applications and the copy of the denied application.
