
This revision to the State Highway System will become effective upon the completion of construction of FAP Project F-216 (16).





At its meeting in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on October the 26th, the Executive Committee took the following action on requests by your Department for changes in the U. S. Route Numbered System in Oklahoma.

The relocation of U. S. Routes 60, 77, and 177 and the designation of a Business Route on U. S. 60 in Ponca City were approved.

The relocation of U. S. Route 62 near Headrick, U. S. Route 64 in Sand Springs and U. S. 270 at McAlester were all approved.

Your request for the extension of U. S. Route 377 from Madill to Cleveland was unanimously denied on the same grounds as previously. However, the Committee will again consider this application if and when this route has been brought up to the necessary geometric design standards required for modern traffic.
