SUBJECT: State Highway System Revision -

Relocation of US 62 in City of Lawton

COUNTY: Comanche

This item requests the relocation of US 62 to Rogers Lane between West 52nd Street and West 82nd Street in the City of Lawton. Construction of this segment of the new Rogers Lane facility is now complete and open to traffic. Also requested as part of this item is the proposed relocation of US 62 just west of the City of Lawton. West 82nd Street will be used as a temporary tie to existing US 62 until the next phase of Rogers Lane between 82nd Street and the existing facility west of Lawton is constructed.

The relocation of US 62 onto Rogers Lane will provide routing on a modern four-lane limited access facility and decrease congestion associated with the present highway in the City of Lawton.

The following actions are necessary to implement this system revision:

Add to the State Highway System a segment of new highway (Rogers Lane) to be designated US 62, beginning at West 52nd Street and extending westward 2.00 miles to West 82nd Street.

Add to the State Highway System, upon **completion of construction**, a segment of new highway (Rogers Lane) to be designated US 62, beginning at West 82nd Street and Rogers Lane and extending southwesterly 1.19 miles to connect with the present facility west of Lawton.

Add US 62T designation to West 82nd Street, beginning at its junction with existing US 62 and extending northward 0.48 mile to the new construction at Rogers Lane. This temporary facility will be removed from the state system upon **completion** of the next phase of Rogers Lane construction. The Department will be responsible for maintenance during the duration of this temporary designation.

Remove from the State Highway System that portion of US 62, beginning at West 52nd Street and extending westward 2.07 miles to West 82nd Street. This section of old US 62 will be transferred to the appropriate local jurisdiction for further maintenance. In accordance with state law, a Public Removal Hearing was held March 26, 1997.

Remove from the State Highway System, upon **completion of new construction**, a portion of US 62 beginning at West 82nd Street and extending westward 0.95 mile. This section of old US 62 will be transferred to the appropriate local jurisdiction for further maintenance. In accordance with state law, a Public Removal Hearing was held March 26, 1997.


Remove US 62T designation from West 52nd Street, beginning at its junction with existing US 62 just north of Cache Road and extending northward 0.88 mile to Rogers Lane. This temporary facility will be removed from the state system and transferred to the appropriate local jurisdiction for further maintenance. In accordance with state law, a Public Hearing was held January 17, 1995.

The relocation of US 62 and the establishment of US 62T must be submitted to the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) for approval.

These proposed revisions will become effective upon approval by the State Transportation Commission and concurrence by AASHTO. Signing of Rogers Lane will be initiated upon receipt of AASHTO approval. The proposed relocation of US 62 will become effective upon approval by the State Transportation Commission, construction of new alignment and concurrence by AASHTO.

The Department recommends approval of this item.


