US Highway 62 Relocation - Kiowa and Tillman Counties


Redesignate US Highway 62 as US Highway 62 Business beginning at its junction with the new location southwest of Snyder and extending easterly through Snyder to its junction with the new location southeast of Snyder, a distance of 7.8 miles.

Add to the State Highway System a segment of new road to be designated as US Highway 62 beginning at its junction with the old road southwest of Snyder and extending east to its junction with the old road southeast of Snyder, a distance of 7.0 miles. This segment of new road is being built as FAP Project F-216(29).

This revision to the State Highway System will become effective upon the completion of its construction.


