US Highway 177 Designation Added


On March 3, 1952, Item 175, the Commission recommended that the highway from Ponca City to US 70 east of Ardmore be submitted to AASHO for a US Highway designation. On July 23, 1952, the route was approved by AASHO as US Highway 177 with some modification and that it would not be marked until constructed to AASHO standards. On August 6, 1962, Item 449, the Commission approved the modification as requested by AASHO.


In order to comply with the action of the previous commission, the Route Numbering Committee made the following recommendations:

- (1) That US Highway 77 be redesignated as State Highway 156 beginning at its junction with US Highway 177 west of Marland and extending east via Marland and north to its junction with US Highway 60.
- (2) That US Highway 177 be redesignated as US Highway 77 beginning at its junction west of Marland and extending northerly to its junction with US Highway 60 east of Tonkawa.
- (3) That US Highway 77 and 177 designations be added on US Highway 60 beginning at its junction east of Tonkawa and extending east to its junction west of Ponca City.
- (4) That US Highway 177 designation be added to US Highway 60 and 77 beginning at its junction west of Ponca City and extending east to its junction with State Highway 40 south of Ponca City.
- (5) That State Highway 40 be redesignated as US Highway 177 beginning at its junction south of Ponca City and extending south to its junction with US Highway 270 northwest of Shawnee.
- (6) That US Highway 177 designation be added to US Highway 270 beginning at its junction northwest of Shawnee and extending southerly to its junction with State Highway 18 at Farrel Street in Shawnee.
- (7) That the junction of State Highway 18 and US Highway 177 and 270 be the southern terminus for State Highway 18.

- (8) That US Highway 177 designation be added on US Highway 270 and that State Highway 18 designation be deleted beginning at its junction at Farrel Street in Shawnee and extending southerly to its junction with State Highway 9 at Tecumseh.
- (9) That State Highway 18 be redesignated as US Highway 177 beginning at its junction with State Highway 9 in Tecumseh and extending southerly to its junction with US Highway 70 at Dickson.
- (10) That AASHO be petitioned to extend US Highway 177 on US 70 beginning at its junction at Dickson and extending southeasterly to Madill, thence on State Highway 99 to the Willis Bridge at the State line.
- (11) That upon approval of US Highway 177, by AASHO State Highway 99 designation will be removed beginning at its junction southwest of Madill and extend southerly to the State line and that State Highway 99C be designated as State Highway 99 beginning at its junction southwest of Madill and extending southwesterly to its junction with State Highway 32.
- (12) That a request be submitted to Texas to extend US Highway 177 to Denton, Texas.

Dear Mr. Greer:

The Oklahoma State Highway Commission, during their March, 1965 meeting, approved the signing of an extension of US 177 from Ponca City, south via Stillwater, Shawnee and Sulphur to a point on US 70 approximately 9 miles east of Ardmore. This route was approved by AASMO by a letter dated 23 July, 1952, with the condition that signs would not be erected until construction was complete on a section of the proposed route from State Mighway 33 south to near Shawnee. Construction is now complete and signs will be erected shortly on this extension.

At the time of AASHO approval of this route, a suggestion that it might be desirable to extend the route on through Madill, Oklahoma, thence south on State Highway 99 over the Willis Bridge to connect with US Highway 377 at Denton, Texas was included in the approval letter. The action taken by the Oklahoma Highway Commission during the March meeting authorized the Department to contact the Texas Highway Department to ascertain your reaction to such a proposal. A copy of the applicable Commission Minutes, AASHO letter of 23 July, 1952 and a map indicating existing and proposed US 177 is enclosed.

Subject to your concurrence, we will initiate a petition to the Route Numbering Committee of the American Association of State Highway Officials for consideration and approval of the extension of US 177 from its present terminus near Ardmore southeasterly to the Willis Bridge at the Texas State line.


