

US 77 Relocation in Oklahoma City

Transfer from the State Highway System a segment of road designated as US Highway 77 beginning at the intersection of Broadway and Reno Street and extending north to N. W. 3rd Street a distance of 0.5 mile. This segment of old road will be transferred to the local jurisdiction of Oklahoma City for further maintenance or abandonment.

Add to the State Highway System a segment of new road to be designated as US Highway 77 beginning at the intersection of Broadway and Reno Street, thence east to Santa Fe Avenue, thence northerly to its intersection with Broadway, a distance of 0.6 mile.

Rerouting of US-77 in the Oklahoma City Downtown Area, Oklahoma County

We would request that the present routing of US-77 north in the downtown area of Oklahoma City be changed to provide a more direct routing.

The present routing is as follows: north on Robinson Avenue to Southwest 5th, then east on Southwest 5th to Broadway Avenue, then north on Broadway Avenue to Reno Avenue, then east on Reno Avenue to Santa Fe Avenue, then north on Santa Fe Avenue to Sheridan Avenue, then west on Sheridan Avenue to Broadway Avenue, and then north on Broadway Avenue to Northwest 23rd Street.

The proposed routing is as follows: north on Robinson Avenue to Southwest 5th Street, then east on Southwest 5th Street to Broadway Avenue, then north on Broadway Avenue to Reno Avenue, then east on Reno Avenue to Santa Fe Avenue, then north on Santa Fe Avenue until it connects with Broadway Avenue at Northwest 3rd, and then north on Broadway Avenue to Northwest 23rd Street.

The net effect of this change would be to eliminate the jog from Santa Fe Avenue to Broadway Avenue at Sheridan and utilize the new Santa Fe Avenue from Sheridan Avenue to Northwest 3rd Street.

This change was discussed with the City of Oklahoma City and they were in agreement.


