

Workplace safety is always a top priority, but when you work with traffic speeding by at 60 miles per hour merely feet away, it becomes especially important to take safety precautions and watch out for your fellow worker. To those who construct, maintain and repair our roads, bridges and interstates, a simple mistake or misstep can have tragic consequences.

At Monday's meeting of the Transportation Commission, Lt. Gov. Jari Askins and Oklahoma Department of Transportation Director Gary Ridley handed out awards to those who demonstrated a continued commitment to safety and have shown great improvement in safety practices this past year.

Since ODOT's safety awards began more than 20 years ago, the total number of employee injury accidents has declined over 77 percent.

The Governor's Safety Excellence Award is presented to the field division with the best overall safety record in the past year. This year's award went to Division Six, which had the lowest lost time per accident and lowest incident frequency and severity rates than any other division.

Division Six, headquartered in Buffalo, consists of Alfalfa, Beaver, Cimarron, Ellis, Harper, Major, Texas, Woods and Woodward counties, and Robert Ward is the Division Engineer.

The Progressive Excellence Award, which is presented to the ODOT field division that has improved its safety rating the most during the past year, was awarded to Division Five, headquartered in Clinton. The division improved its safety performance 65 percent from last year. Division Five consists of Beckham, Blaine, Custer, Dewey, Greer, Harmon, Jackson, Kiowa, Roger Mills, Tillman and Washita counties, and Brent Almquist is the Division Engineer.

The Director's Safety Awards were presented to the unit in each of ODOT's eight field divisions and its Oklahoma City headquarters with the best safety record. This year's winners are:
