You can now travel down history's highways with the map that's been 100 years in the making. "Moving Oklahoma Forward," the theme of the official 2011-2012 state map, commemorates 100 years of transportation history in the state, beginning with the June 1911 formation of the State Department of Highways and continuing through today's Oklahoma Department of Transportation.

The bifold, centennial edition map features a pictorial essay of Oklahoma's transportation history, while the map's eye-catching metallic gold cover sets off a mock cut-out "100," representing a century of transportation in the state.

A message from Oklahoma's first female governor, Mary Fallin, encourages an exploration of America's most diverse terrain per mile – from towering mesas and spacious plains in the west to rolling hills and mountainsides in the east.

The map features significant milestones of each decade during the past century and pinpoints destinations of both natural and manmade interest statewide and includes traveler information, such as a state parks facilities guide, helpful phone numbers and Web addresses to assist drivers while traveling in our state. Also included are a mileage chart; detailed maps of Oklahoma City, Tulsa, Capitol area, Lawton/Ft. Sill, Enid, Stillwater and Muskogee; and all turnpike routes.

New to this year's map are 2D barcodes, readable by dedicated QR barcode readers and camera phones, providing a mobile link to the ODOT or TravelOK.com home page.

Design and development of the state map is a continual process among ODOT and its state agency partners, the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority and the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department. Planning for this map began in early 2010. A total of 2.2 million copies of the 2011-2012 state map are being printed in four cycles over two years at an estimated cost of \$265,300. At each printing, generally every six months, the map is updated as needed.

Maps are free of charge at any of the 12 welcome centers statewide, all ODOT division offices and the Tourism and Recreation Department offices. The map is also available to view on the ODOT Web site www.okladot.state.ok.us.
