August Transportation Commission Meeting

The Oklahoma Transportation Commission will hold a special meeting at 11 a.m. Monday, Aug. 12 in the R.A. Ward Transportation Building, 200 N.E. 21st St. in Oklahoma City. Items to be addressed at the meeting:

- The Oklahoma Department of Transportation's project to relocate and reconstruct the I-40 Crosstown in Oklahoma City recently received an award in a competition of western states. Director Mike Patterson will present a regional America's Transportation Award from the Western Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials.
- Patterson will also introduce Paul Green, who was named director of operations in July. Green was previously Division Four Engineer and oversaw all construction and maintenance operations in the eleven-county division in north-central Oklahoma that includes most of the Oklahoma City metro area.
- Commissioners will be asked to consider awarding a nearly \$5.4 million contract for highway and bridge reconstruction on SH-1 in Latimer county near Talihina.
- They are expected to vote on awarding a more than \$2 million contract to resurface more than eight miles of I-40 near McLoud and Shawnee in Pottawatomie County.
- The commission is expected to vote on a \$3.5 million contract for bridge rehabilitation work on the US-60 bridge over Bird Creek in Pawhuska in Osage County.

The commission, an eight-member panel appointed by the governor to oversee the state's transportation development, awards project contracts for road and bridge construction on a monthly basis.
