## **December Transportation Commission Meeting**

The Oklahoma Transportation Commission will hold its monthly meeting at 11 a.m. Monday, Dec. 3, in the R.A. Ward Transportation Building, 200 N.E. 21<sup>st</sup> St. in Oklahoma City. Items to be addressed at the meeting include:

- The Oklahoma Floodplain Managers Association will recognize the Oklahoma
  Department of Transportation for the successful completion of the Perryman Ditch along
  I-44 in Tulsa. Construction of this more than one mile long structure greatly improved
  drainage for 1,264 Tulsa homes and businesses by redirecting storm water to the
  Arkansas River.
- Oklahomans can plan to see continued bridge improvements across the state in 2013.
   Commissioners are expected to vote on a \$5.3 million contract to replace two bridges on US-60 near Lamont in Grant County and a \$4.7 million contract for replacement of a bridge on US-70 in McCurtain County.
- The commission will consider a nearly \$3.4 million contract for a bridge replacement project on SH-51 near Mannford in Creek County. This project will use accelerated bridge construction techniques to assemble the bridge alongside its final location and then set it in place, resulting in a road closure of less than 21 days.

The commission, an eight-member panel appointed by the governor to oversee the state's transportation development, awards project contracts for road and bridge construction on a monthly basis.
