



**Whereas**, construction and repairs to Oklahoma highways must often be done on roads alongside traffic, putting both motorists and workers at risk every day; and

**Whereas**, emergency repairs or accidents cause unexpected work zones along Oklahoma highways, which places crews and responders in direct contact with traffic; and

**Whereas**, preliminary 2014 statistics show 10 people were killed and 600 injured in 1,145 collisions in Oklahoma work zones; and

**Whereas**, in the past five years, 89 people have been killed and 4,461 injured in 8,285 accidents in Oklahoma work zones; and

**Whereas**, many of these fatalities and injuries were caused by inattentive driving, following too closely and speeding in construction zones; and

**Whereas**, by state law the fines for speeding in work zones are doubled; and

**Whereas**, drivers should set aside distractions, be extra cautious and give work zones their undivided attention when traveling; and

**Whereas**, in its history, 57 Oklahoma Department of Transportation employees have been killed in the line of duty, more than any other state agency;

Dow, therefore, I, Alary Jallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim March 23-27, 2015,
