



## 100 Years of Oklahoma's Transportation Celebrated in Tulsa FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE September 23, 2011 PR# 11-057

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation opened its doors to the public in Tulsa on Friday, Sept. 23, to celebrate 100 years of transportation in Oklahoma. Hundreds of current and former Division 8 employees joined citizens and dignitaries for an open house and to tour displays of equipment and memorabilia.

"As part of our centennial celebrations, we are showing our appreciation for the public's support of a better transportation system," ODOT Chief Engineer Gary Evans said. "We have hosted open houses across the state this year to share the story of 100 years of transportation, and to provide educational opportunities about our programs."

Division 8 includes Craig, Creek, Delaware, Mayes, Nowata, Osage, Ottawa, Pawnee, Rogers, Tulsa and Washington counties. This area has a long history of important transportation moments, including:

- In November 1916, the first toll road on record in Oklahoma was constructed from Chelsea to Claremore in Rogers County.
- In November 1922, a massive federally funded project to pave 64 miles of roadway was completed in Tulsa County.
- In September 1935, the first Federal WPA Highway Project in the state was awarded for the construction of US-66 (now US-69) in Ottawa County.
- In September 1964, the I-44/US-169 interchange in Tulsa was completed.

A comprehensive look at the origins of transportation in our state can be found in the new coffee table book, ODOT100: Celebrating the First 100 Years of Transportation in Oklahoma. This limited edition book traces the origins of transportation in our state, the challenges faced throughout the decades and the current accomplishments on topics such as interstates, bridges, waterways and rail.
