62. Director's Report

Director Ridley acknowledged efforts of all Department Maintenance Workers from across the state who worked so diligently during the recent snow storm in the northwestern part of our state. Commissioner Benbrook who is a resident of this area, thanked all workers for their hard work and said they did a tremendous job of clearing the highways.

Director Ridley introduced Mr. Steve Burrage, State Auditor. Mr. Burrage was appointed by Governor Henry to be watchdog of the State's federal stimulus money. Noting that his office has four auditors at ODOT at all times, he complemented the Agency's ongoing efforts to be accountable to taxpayers.

Director Ridley stated that stimulus money would be used for construction projects only, and discussed the process to be used for the highway projects, e.g., advertising for bids, open competitive bidding process, etc. All stimulus project expenditures by the Department will be presented to the Commission for approval. He further explained the process for accounting for the money, stating that stimulus money would not be used for supplements to projects, change orders, etc.
